Just prior to Christmas the management Committee elected a new President, Yours truly.

The 1985-86 season yield, showed much promise for our future years. Our Gold, Silver & Bronze and Player Sponsors once again proved very beneficial and our many thanks to each sponsor. The Promotion and Development Committee have been hard at work providing your club with expertise of sound business and field management for the Club. Many thanks to Steve Morris, Chairman, and his committee, Cliff Brougham, Gary Hancock, Wally Marks & Skip Haynes. Working among these gentleman is a treat. Our new uniform was in particular one of their promotions. Many thanks to the senior players meetings for their co-operation in the end design. Personally, and from all reports, the new look Goodwood uniform has been well received by the baseball fraternity.

The P & D committee have spent endless hours planning the club developments, over the next three years. This has been deliberately designed to co-incide with our centenary celebrations in 1989. Many eyes will be upon us, as we are the oldest baseball club in Australia.

We all must support this planning, and take its fullest advantage to ensure our centenary celebrations are a huge success, on and off the field. Although previous seasons have been a little lean for the club I am quite sure we will once again establish ourselves as the prominent baseball club of S.A.

Our club newsletter "Smoke Signals", has as usual, kept its regular editions of club news and topics, thanks to the many business people who have generously supported us in this area. To its editor Marg Mortimer, the Printer, husband John Mortimer, along with the typists, collators and delivering team, thank you for working so well under such difficulties. Incidently, most of this team, like Marg & John Mortimer, are lifemembers. I urge everbody to give this important publication their fullest support in their immediate future and beyond. It is the vital organ of club news, and reaches not only club members, but also reaches supporters the S.A.B.L. and club sponsors.

The co-operation given so freely by fellow users of the oval and clubrooms has definitely been very much appreciated. The Mitcham Council with their follow-up support given to our hard working ground staff has produced one of the best playing surfaces in the league. Then, of course our clubrooms and amenities are second to none. However they are very expensive to maintain. I urge everybody to support the facilities as much as possible. After all the complex costs us about \$70 per member. Add this to the S.A.B.L. costs we are well over \$250 per senior player to cover our existance. Last year senior fees were \$85 per player. A far cry from the amount needed for 86/87. This is a harsh fact. Our club environment is very extensive and also very expensive.

The lack of support at the last A.G.M. for a social convenor was a very costly exercise. The extra duties involved in this fund raising area were forced into management. This unjust overload was an unfair burden to the club, it could have caused a financial disaster. However, management met twice as frequently, worked three times as hard, to maintain the club's bouyancy in money. To all my fellow committee, a huge thank you for your loyal and industrious support thoughout the whole season.

Some may criticise, that I umpired thoughout the year, while carrying out my President's duties. Personally this gave me a huge advantage, I moved amongst the whole baseball fraternity. Thus it gave me great chances in public relations and allowed my judgements still to contain the best interest for the Goodwood Baseball Club.

I have enjoyed sharing the season with you all. So once again, thank you sponsors, committee, club members, and supporters.

TREASURERS REPORT 1986/86

The Club finished the season with a profit of \$394.72 in the cheque account leaving a closing balance \$4848.55. The Social account has a closing balance of \$457.45, Centenary Account \$2031.76 and Coaching Account \$83.75. Due to not having a Social Convenor this year, the Management Committee were left with the task of fund raising a budgetted figure of \$11,334.00. It managed to raise only \$8500.00. The most disappointing fundraiser this season was the MAS/Venture Raffle, with a net figure of only \$1417.40 out of a possible \$6500.00. Next season I hop there is more support for this raffle. Once again Phil White has raised \$1500.00 from his lucky tickets and John Bushell has raised \$1000.00 selling Bingo tickets at his place of business. The Kitchen netted \$286.94 (a drop from last season, due to programme schedule) the Canteen netted \$1043.44 (this was achieved with the help of Pee-Wee running it on Friday Evenings and T-Ball running it on Saturday Mornings.) Once again Members of Management had to look after these two areas. Anyone interested in either Kitchen or Canteen for the coming season will be appreciated.

The Life Members Board has now been completed at a cost of \$316.00 with a donation from Glen Clements of \$150.00 towards this cost. The Backstop still has 6 annual repayments of \$773.04 to be made. The biggest expense is S.A.B.L. fees, this year the total figure being \$6611.00. Other major expenses are; Membership to C.L.G. Assoc. \$1245.00 (\$10 Senior Members, \$5 Junior Members), Baseballs \$1170.00, Equipment \$620.76 and Grounds \$528.81.

To keep membership fees from increasing and to meet 1986/87 committments the Social Committee will again be asked to raise a large sum of money and will be looking for strong support from Members. I would still like to see stronger support for the Club in the area of Associate or Non-Playing Memberships.

On closing I would like to thank the people who have helped management with the social functions and also the people who have helped me in the Canteen.
